



## **SOUTH FYLDE LINE CRP Action Plan update February 2022**

### **API: Community Rail Development (CRDS pillars 1, 3 & 4)**

#### **1. Restoring Your Railway (RYR)**

As the management group will be aware a successful RYR bid was made by the two local MPs namely Mark Menzies and Scott Benton. Co-ordination of the project has been taken forward by Fylde Borough Council (FBC) with Andrew Loynd in the lead. A project steering group was formed comprising representatives from Lancashire County Council, Fylde Borough Council, Blackpool Council, CRL, Northern, Network Rail and DfT.

The first stage in the RYR process is the production of a SOBC (Strategic Outline Business Case) and this was completed and sent to the DfT before Christmas 2021 see news item for more details and a link to the Executive Summary of the SOBC.

A public consultation formed part of the development of the SOBC and in all 255 people responded to this opportunity. A big thank you to everyone who took the time to share their thoughts about the line and its future.

The project if ultimately successful will see services on the SFL improved with possibly the introduction of a passing loop to enable a half hourly heavy rail service to operate between Preston and Blackpool South. However, the study will also evaluate other alternatives as well including tram-train and conversion to light rail.

#### **2. Accreditation**

The re-accreditation meeting took place on the 13<sup>th</sup> October, 2021 and I am delighted to report that CRL and the 4 Lancashire CRPs have been successfully re-accredited for a further year. For more details go to:

### **AP3: Improve Integration**

This has been led by Vernon Smith on behalf of the CRP. A key focus has been responding to the National Bus Strategy and the development of BSIPs by Blackpool Council and Lancashire County Council see the links above in API point 5.

### **AP4: Station Developments**

CRL will continue to support the station groups along the line. Below are some of the projects taking place along the South Fylde Line.

#### **Preston**

##### **Platforms 3C & 4C**

As you see from AP3 the Ormskirk service will be permanently linked to the Colne service from December 2022. Northern has confirmed that the service will continue to use platforms 3C & 4C at least until HS2 remodelling of platforms 3 & 4 take out the 2 bays. To improve the environment at this 'lonely' part of the station CRL & Lancashire CC have worked on an application to the Avanti Community Rail fund for the provision of seats, planters and information panels. At the time of writing this report the application to Avanti had been submitted and a decision awaited.

##### **Artwork Update:**

A small-scale postcard project is being undertaken by a Supported Internship Student group that works out of County Hall, Preston. A larger project is also being developed to display artwork on Platform 7.

##### **Dick, Kerr Ladies**

Work continues on the 'Granny' film to celebrate the Dick, Kerr Ladies. Thanks to Avanti for allowing the film crew to film on the train.

## **AP5: Timetable Developments**

### **Manchester Recovery Task Force (MRTF) – consultation on the December 2022 timetables.**

At the last meeting it was anticipated that a consultation would take place on revised plans to improve the reliability of services, especially those using the Castlefield Corridor in Manchester. A public consultation on draft timetables for December 2022 was undertaken in the weeks leading up to Christmas. CRL submitted a response to this on behalf of the 4 Lancashire CRPs which can be made available to CRP members on request to Richard Watts.

The proposed changes affect all services including those on the so called 'Lancashire Triangle' i.e. Preston to Colne, Ormskirk and Blackpool South. The proposed changes see the Preston to Blackpool South service operated as a stand-alone service on Mondays to Saturdays. The Sunday service is hourly with two hourly extensions to Colne. On weekdays trains leave Blackpool South at xx30 and from Preston at xx49 past each hour ie 14 minutes later than now.

Northern has confirmed that the hourly Sunday service will be reintroduced from the May timetable change.

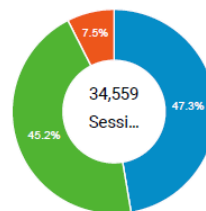

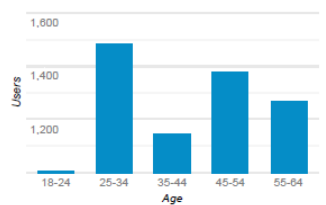
