Rail union: RMT will put on a series of 48 hour strikes in December and January after industry bosses failed to offer any new deals to reach a settlement.

Over 40,000 members across Network and 14 Train Operating Companies will take strike action on 13, 14, 16 and 17 December and on January 3, 4, 6 and 7.

There will also be an overtime ban across the railways from 18 December until 2 January, meaning RMT be taking industrial action for 4 weeks.

Despite every effort made by our negotiators, it is clear that the government is directly interfering with our attempts to reach a settlement.

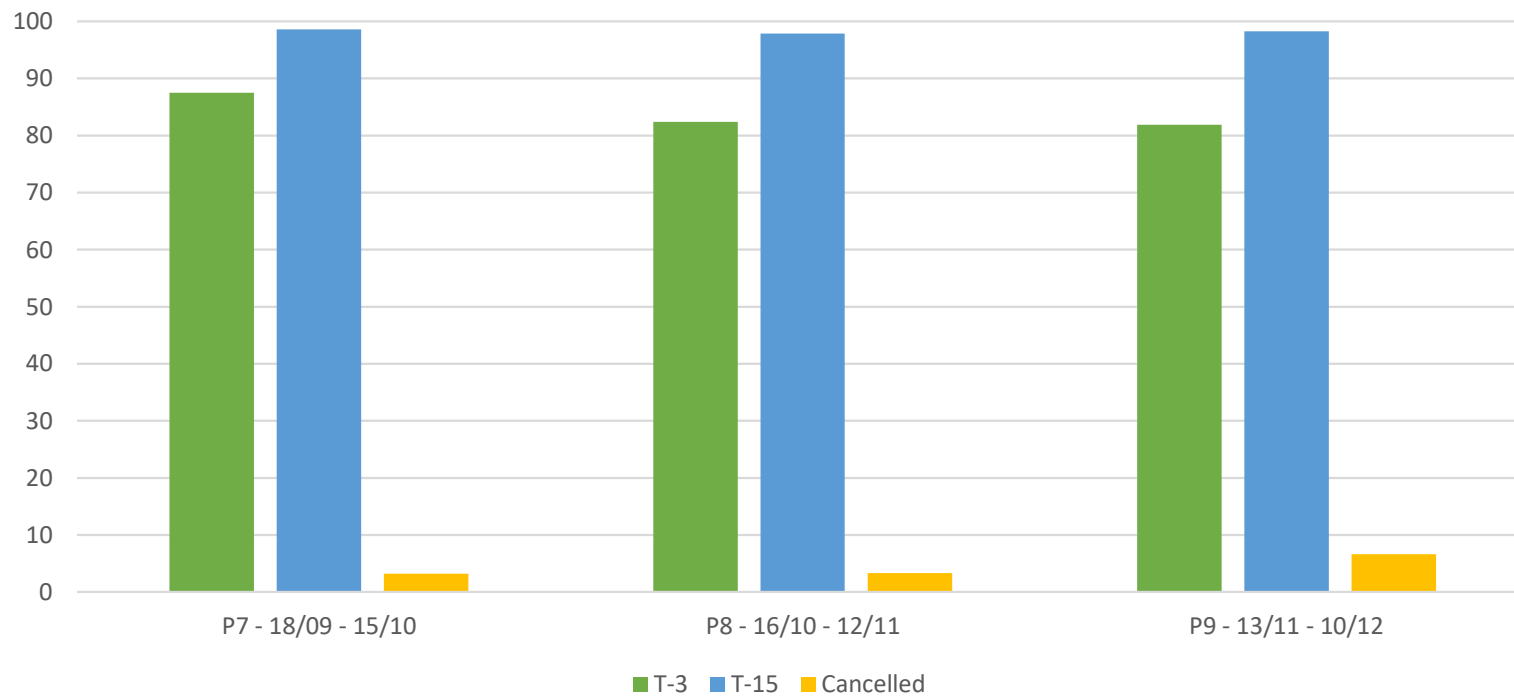
The union suspended previous strike action in good faith to allow for intensive negotiations to resolve the dispute.

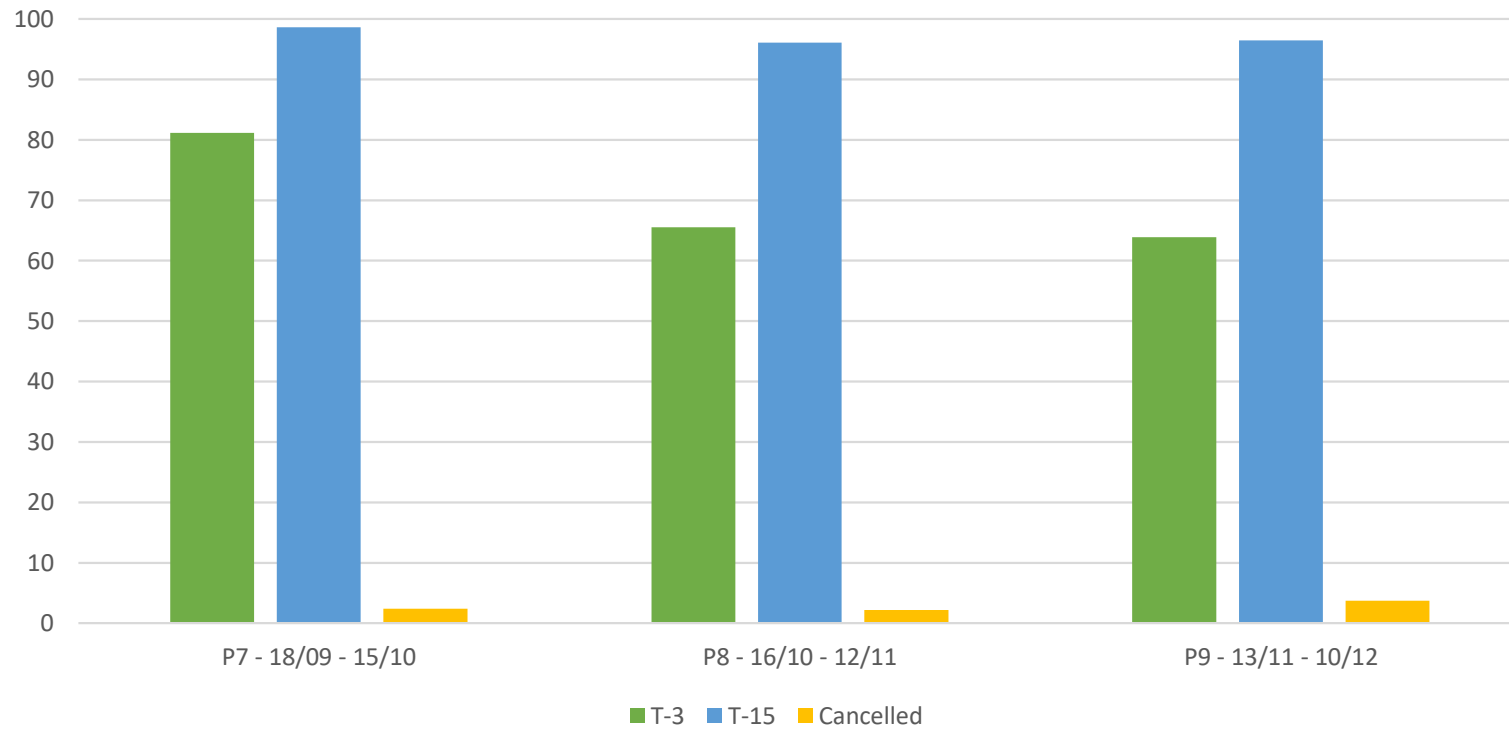

Clitheroe - Manchester Victoria Service Group Performance



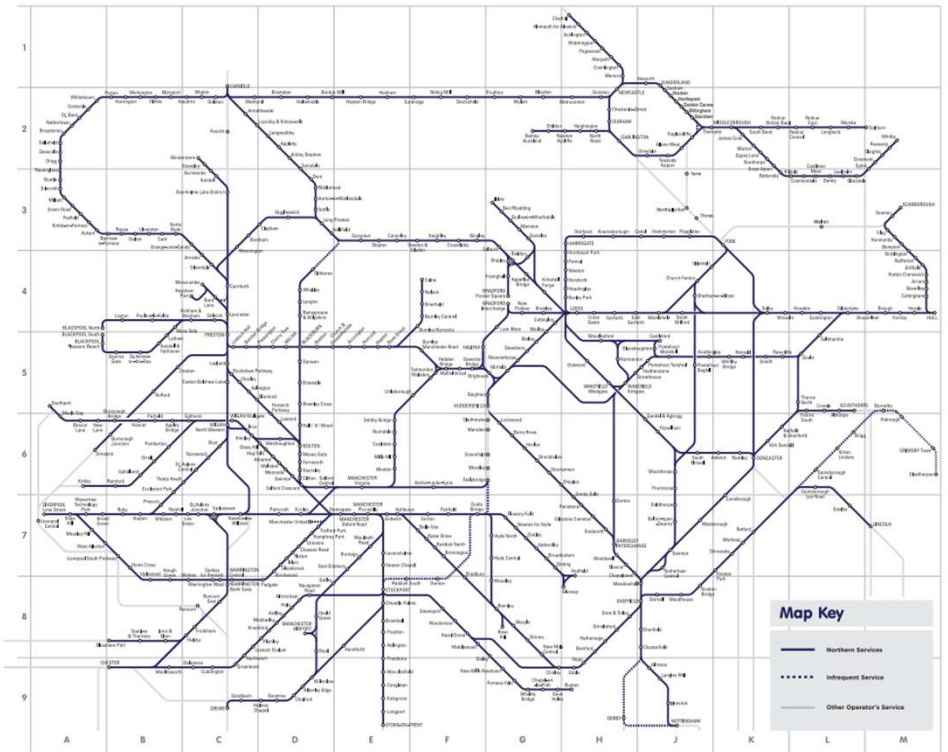

Train Service Frequency

- The majority of our services only operate at an hourly frequency or less (83%)
- 50 Routes have a basic hourly frequency
- 9 Routes have less than an hourly service
- 12 Routes have a half hourly frequency
- The higher frequency routes are those busier routes between the big conurbations such as Sheffield – Leeds or Manchester – Bolton - Preston



Train Service Capacity

Around **80%** of our 2660 daily train **services** are operated by a single train and most of them are just 2 carriage trains;

Majority of our fleet makeup is a 2 carriage train;

2 Carriage Trains	205 (all diesel)
3 Carriage Trains	(48 electric + 63 diesel)
4 Carriage Trains	(43 electric + 8 Bi-mode)

Only 20% of service operated in multiple meaning there are limited opportunities for de-strengthening with the majority made up of just 2 x 2 car trains coupled together.

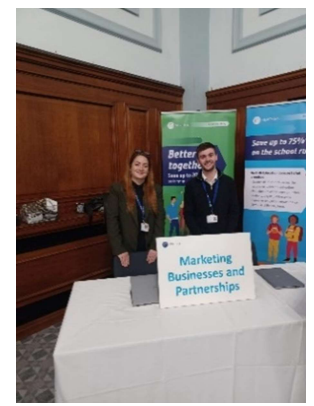
