Skelmersdale TrainLink update:

- The TrainLink service successfully transferred to Headbolt Lane on Sunday 9th June 2024 with a new route serving Bank Lane and County Road into Kirkby.
- Integrated bus / rail ticketing products have also been introduced for purchase on TrainLink bus and Merseyrail services.
- Leaflets advertising the service will be delivered door-to-door in Skelmersdale later this month.

Preston platforms 3c/4c: The Community Rail noticeboard for the West of Lancashire Line has now been installed on Platform 3c at Preston Railway Station. Hanging baskets, artificial flowers and brackets have been delivered to Avanti West Coast for final installation along with additional seating.

Preston Butler Street cycle link: The new segregated cycle link on Butler Street has been surfaced and lined. The missing link between Preston City Centre, Avenham Park, Miller Park and South Ribble now has railway approvals and will be delivered later in Summer 2024.

Restoring Your Railway: Burscough Curves and Midge Hall: No LCC funding at the present time for additional business case work regarding infrastructure and services on the West Lancashire Line.

Merseyrail extension studies: Further updates have been requested from the Liverpool City Region regarding their study work to use battery electric multiple units to extend from Headbolt Lane – Wigan and Ormskirk – Burscough Junction – Preston.

Network North Plan: Published in October 2024 by the Department for Transport at https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/network-north Detailed guidance from central government has been delayed by the general election. Future priorities are being looked at by Lancashire County Council.

National Access for All programme: The Department for Transport announced the successful Access for All projects to be delivered between 2024 and 2029 in May 2024. Lancashire's successful scheme is Church and Oswaldtwistle which will have further design development work undertaken.

Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plans: The County Council has consulted on draft plans for developing walking and cycling networks across Lancashire which will set the scene for future investment in greener, safer and healthier travel opportunities. The plans are

LCC Bus Service Improvement Plan: The County Council's Bus Service Improvement Plan includes a range of measures to make buses better with improvements including:

- Simpler cheaper fares i.e. £1 on Sundays
- Multi-modal and multi-operator ticketing in Preston, Fylde Coast and Skelmersdale TrainLink
- Bus service enhancements

- Our Regions Support Team led by Paul Webster works with members across the
 country on day-to-day community rail support provided by Jenni Jones (SWR & GWR), Ian
 Davis (North), Rhiannon-Jane Raftery (Wales), with Paul supporting the East Midlands and
 Anglia and Martin Clarke the South East. Our Thematic Project Developments Team
 is led by Martin looking after Education (through Karen Bennet), Training & Development
 (Alex Peel) and Integrated Sustainable Transport (Gary Shipp).
- The Community Rail Development Fund (for DfT accredited CRPs) & Small Grants Fund for 2024-2025 are open! The CRDF can support projects up to £25,000 (subject to match funding) and the SGF is for Station Adoption Groups projects up to £1000 from CRP projects up to £2500. The fund is open until 31st March 2025, although projects do not need to be completed until 30th June 2025. - Following the **election**, we can assure you of our close work with the DfT to ensure the voice of community rail is heard. We have written to Louise Haigh, Secretary of State for Transport, and Lord Peter Hendy, Minister of State for Rail, congratulating them on their appointments and hope to secure meetings soon, as well as building broader links across the new administration and with regional mayors. The King's speech on **I7**th **July** is likely to include legislation to nationalise the railways and plans for GBR. With the arrival of so many new MPs, we suggest writing to your local MP to introduce your organisation and community rail we have a **letter template** on the website for you to use.
- We continue to develop the range of Corporate Partners who can support and help your work. This will be a year which marks not just trains and infrastructure, but also the role of railways in social and community development over the last 200 years... and will also look to innovation and the future too. The celebration is not just for the North East as the aim is to showcase and open-up collections of railway history in local libraries, museums, and railway stations too. The scheme includes railway safety, station based activities, rail confidence and a rail experience.
