Community Rail Network - Update for CRP meetings



October 9th 2024

- Our new Value & impact of Community Rail report was released in September which shows through rigorous research and example case studies the real social value of community rail activities. Headline figures for the work delivered by over 1,300 station adoption groups and our 75 CRP members include:
 - A social return of £17.89 for every £1.00 invested
 - o An annual social value of £129 million from funding of £7.2 million
 - Directly engages with over 125,000 people per year
 - Works with 65,000 young people from more than 2,000 schools and youth organisations
 - o Each year **8.250 volunteers give 380,000 hours** of time with a social value of **£30.9 million**

- The 2024-25 Community Rail Development Fund (for DfT accredited CRPs) & Small Grants Fund (for station adoption groups) is open for applications. CRDF can support projects up to £25,000 (subject to match funding) and SGF is for Station Adoption Group projects up to £1000. The CRDF fund is open until 31st March 2025, although projects do not need to be completed until 30th June 2025. - We have met with a number of regional mayors and sub-national transport bodies and are soon to meet the Rail Minister - getting the message across that adequate recognition of members' community rail is noticed and funding secured to help deliver outstanding community rail activities.
- The launch of Railway 200 took place in September which is building up to a year of celebrations in 2025 to mark the 200th anniversary of the start of the modern railway era. This will be a year not just about looking back or talking about trains and infrastructure, but also the role of railways in social and community development over the last 200 years... and will also look to education, innovation and the future too. A touring Exhibition Train and many national events are planned, but also you are encouraged to register local collections of railway history in libraries, museums, and railway stations and local events too. - We have recently been awarded a Travelling with Confidence grant from the Motability Foundation
 for a two-year programme of work with four CRPs (CR Lancashire, GO CRP, Severnside CRP & South
 East Communities RP) engaging and empowering disabled people, promoting independent mobility
 and using rail and connecting modes. A dedicated grants pot will also be available for other members
 to access, and resources will be developed to help raise awareness of this important topic.
- Our partnership with Scouts on the Platforms for Change scheme continues to grow with 290 Scout groups registered and matched with 165 station adoption groups a reach to around 5,000 young people. The scheme includes rail safety, station-based activities, rail confidence and a rail experience.  - From 14th October 2024 to 3rd November 2024, we are running our 'Days out by Rail' campaign encouraging more people to take the train for greener, healthier leisure journeys.  - The National Community Rail Awards takes place in Newcastle on 13th March 2025 with Lumo & Hull Trains as headline sponsors. We had a record breaking 227 entries for the awards which we are reviewing with a shoer list announced on 11th December 2024.
