Lancashire County Council - Mike Cliff

Skelmersdale TrainLink

- Fares revised in March with £3 single and multimodal bus / rail fares available
- £6.30 off peak daysaver with 50% reduction for children and 16-18s
- Skelmersdale local services revised on 31st August to better tie in with Trainlink services
- Preston Bus operating the service from 20th July with timetable adjustments

Restoring Your Railway

- MP interest in the RYR schemes including Burscough Curves
- Network Rail study underway to look at potential Merseyrail extensions including the Ormskirk Preston and Headbolt Lane Wigan Wallgate corridors with LCC and Liverpool City Region CA involvement

Lancashire County Council

- New LCC administration reviewing transport priorities
- Local Transport Plan 4 consultation planned later in 2025
- Lancashire Combined County Authority continues to roll-out
- £215m of devolved capital Local Transport Grant funding has been received in the 4 years until 2029/30

OPSTA - Denis O'Connell

A). The Southport line is still suffering from a deficient service mainly due to the Class 769's having consistent failures which in turn leads to 2 - car DMU's being used for rush hour trains and throughout the day. The Sunday service is not good. We still await what Northern have to say about a Sunday working agreement with their guards. It is worth noting that South Western Railway have had such an agreement for more than the last 25 years, for both their drivers and guards. Northern have an agreement with their drivers but are still waiting for their guards, and that is after the last attempt was rejected.

B The Ormskirk line is running at about 2-3% cancellations which is better than before, but consistency is sought.

- C). We are seriously against the proposals for reorganising Oxford Road down to 2 running lines and a Bay from the present 4 running lines and a Bay. If it goes through, then there is no chance of the Southport to Manchester Airport service being reinstated in the future.
- D). With regard to Midge Hall, we are waiting to see what the new Reform led LCC come up with in terms of a transport policy.
- E). The Burscough curve (s) and possible through running to Preston is still being talked about in various circles. As always, cash is the problem. Note current edition of Rail magazine mentions this in an article on Page 60.

Trying to be proactive we are meeting Northern people with regard to Part (A) above with some ideas to make matters better.
