Railway 200 Exhibition Train

We're sure you've all seen by now that <u>Railway 200</u> has confirmed the route for the first three months of the <u>Exhibition Train</u>. The bicentenary train, named *Inspiration*, will visit 60 locations across Britain over 12 months (including several community rail lines and stations), promoting rail innovation and careers with interactive displays. Active Bystander Training

The <u>Suzy Lamplugh Trust</u> is running a series of 30-minute training sessions on standing up against harassment. The free and participative sessions are designed to empower more people to be active bystanders when they see harassment taking place, without putting their own safety at risk. New resources

As part of our work with the <u>Foundation for Integrated Transport</u>, we have produced a <u>practical guide</u> to support community organisations in leading on modal integration initiatives. It takes a step-by-step approach to the planning, delivery and review of activities to integrate different forms of public, shared and active transport; to help people access the opportunities they want in a more sustainable way.

The resource itself is best viewed as a 'slide show' due to the inclusion of animations and links within and outside of the document.

We are also pleased to be publishing two new guidance resources for members, both sponsored by Northern. The first is a guide on <u>community rail and tackling anti-social behaviour</u>, particularly at stations, and the second is a guide on <u>community rail and engaging in local planning and</u>

<u>development</u>, building on the work of Gloucestershire CRP's 'Connecting Communities' guide.

Railway 200

The route for the exhibition train is likely to be formally announced at the end of January: we will update you when we can. Meanwhile, members are invited to the next <u>Education Network meeting</u> on Thursday 20 February, where a representative from Railway 200 will be talking specifically about the Exhibition Train.

- We have recently been awarded a Travelling with Confidence grant from the Motability
 Foundation for a two-year programme of work with four CRPs (CR Lancashire, GO CRP,
 Severnside CRP & South East Communities RP) engaging and empowering disabled people,
 promoting independent mobility and using rail and connecting modes. A dedicated grants
 pot will also be available for other members to access, and resources will be developed to
 help raise awareness of this important topic.
- Community Rail Development Fund (CRDF)

The 2025-26 Community Rail Development Fund is now open.

Accredited community rail partnerships in England and Wales can apply to this funding scheme, which Community Rail Network administers on behalf of the Department for Transport. It is intended to support projects and activities set out in CRPs' annual plans. The maximum grant for projects in this funding period is £25,000.

You must speak to your usual **contact** within our support and development team to discuss your project before submitting any bid.

- Small Grants Fund (England)
- The 2025-26 Small Grants Fund (England) is open for applications.

Community Rail Network members in England can apply for small grants of up to £2,500 for non-accredited community rail partnerships and community station members, or £1,000 for station friends, adopters and small groups, through this scheme which Community Rail Network administers on behalf of the Department for Transport.

Transport for Greater Manchester (TfGM) Small Grants Fund

Transport for Greater Manchester (TfGM) is providing funding and wider support to community groups who want to improve Greater Manchester's rail stations. They have made a funding pot available for project bids from community rail partnerships and station friends' groups. CRPs and Community Stations can bid for up to £1,500. Friends Groups can bid for up to £500.

Bids will be assessed on their benefit to local communities. We are looking for evidence-based submissions on what the project is hoping to achieve. This could be, for example:

- Greater local engagement
- Reduced crime
- Improved recycling rates

(Note: projects should not be primarily aimed at increasing rail patronage).

There is no limit on the number of bids each CRP or Friends Groups can make. All bids must be submitted on the form below and emailed to grants@communityrail.org.uk and will be assessed by TfGM and Community Rail Network, and, where appropriate, Network Rail. Where appropriate submissions will be shared with Network Rail and train operators to a) seek relevant approvals and b) seek additional or match funding. Once a request has been approved funds will be distribute via Community Rail Network.

TfGM are also keen to help applicants with their projects and will also be happy to provide communications support, for example writing press releases or profiling your project on social media.

TfGM's rail officers also keen to help you plan your project and also, where necessary, liaise with Network Rail and the train operators. TfGM may also be able to provide volunteer support. This will be measured as a funding contribution of £15 per hour. Community involvement in rail stations is hugely important and is highly valued by TfGM. It is a key part of their plan to transform rail stations into community hubs that provide access to a range of essential services.

- Our partnership with Scouts on the Platforms for Change scheme continues to grow with 270 Scout groups registered and matched with 130 station adoption groups – a reach to over 4.500 young people! The scheme includes railway safety, station-based activities, rail confidence and a rail experience. Please continue to spread the word about the project to local Scouts organisations and to your station adoption groups and encourage them to visit our page to register their interest. - We continue to develop our work with our Corporate Partners, the latest being with Team
 BA who provide media and comms services to the rail industry. Their offer to community rail
 is 50 hours of free mentoring and support for Community Rail Network members and

- Several rail industry Corporate Partners can support and help your activities as shown on

- Bespoke training for <u>members</u> is also available recent sessions have helped CRPs think
 about their governance structure, overall aims and visions and their marketing &
 communications messages. Members can also apply for Training Bursaries of up to £200 for
 courses of their own choosing that will help CRP Officers in their role. Contact Alex Peel or
