The Rail Experience – Confidence on the Rails!

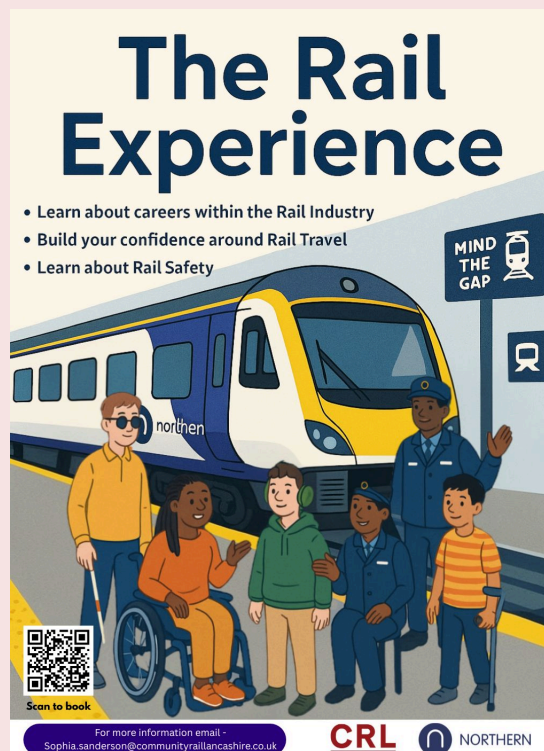

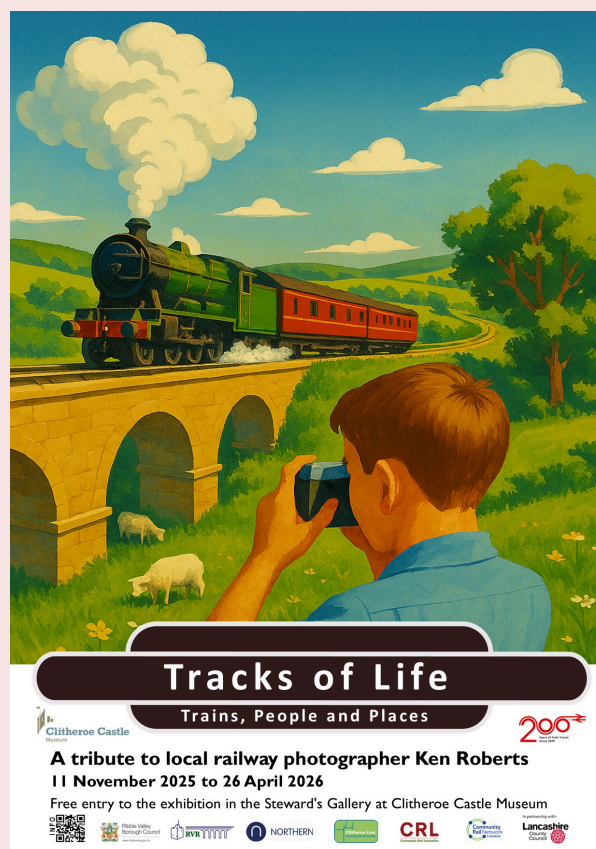
Full Steam Ahead! An Author Talk with Susan Brownrigg
