Call for Projects - Lancaster Environment Centre

Do you have an idea you'd love to explore, but not the time, money or capacity to make it happen? Each year, postgraduate students from Lancaster Environment Centre undertake substantial research projects as part of their Masters degrees and many of these projects are delivered in partnership with external organisations.

These students specialise in ecology and conservation, environmental science, and geography. They bring strong skills in field and laboratory work, survey design, data analysis, interpretation and evidence-based recommendations. By proposing a project, you can gain a motivated student working full-time from mid-April to early September 2027, supported by academic supervision, while enabling them to complete a high-quality dissertation.

Projects should offer a meaningful research challenge, align with one of our areas of expertise and avoid unaccompanied fieldwork. Projects are typically free, apart from reimbursement of student travel expenses. Limited funding is available for essential research costs.

Over the summer, Community Rail Lancashire has been working with the Forest of Bowland National Landscape team to promote Eco Escapes and encourage more people to explore Lancashire sustainably.

But what is Eco Escapes?

Eco Escapes is a collection of sustainable, car-free days out and short breaks, designed to help people explore some of Lancashire's most beautiful places by train, bus, bike and on foot.

Each Eco Escape provides a ready-made itinerary, making it easy for visitors to plan a day out or short break without relying on the car. The downloadable guides include suggested walking and cycling routes, public transport information and recommendations for places to visit, eat and stay. The Forest of Bowland is the perfect place for an Eco Escape. Visitors can enjoy spectacular countryside, fascinating heritage, wildlife and welcoming local businesses, all while reducing the environmental impact of their journey.

There is something for everyone, from gentle woodland walks and accessible routes to challenging hikes and multi-day adventures. Highlights include the historic village of Chipping, Spring Wood near Whalley, Pendle Hill, the Hodder Valley and the Ribble Valley Jubilee Trail.

"We're thrilled to collaborate with the Forest of Bowland National Landscape on the Eco Escapes itineraries, based around Clitheroe and Whalley stations on the Clitheroe Line. 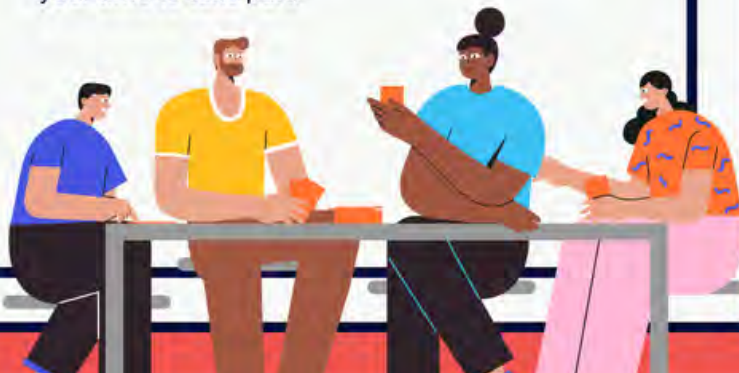
What is climate and nature action? It's about improving our lives and protecting the future of our communities, places and nature. Climate and nature action is not only about caring for the environment. It's also about more affordable energy bills, sustainable homes, better access to green/blue space, green skills or qualifications, or helping people in times of change or disruption.

Is this workshop for me? If you have a stake in or are involved in supporting local communities or places to live better today and be more prepared for the future, then join us! You don't have to explicitly be working on climate and nature-related activities or have climate and nature-related knowledge.

What will I get from it? You'll join a one-day workshop alongside a range of people and organisations taking action in their communities and places. Together we'll map out local assets, existing climate and nature action, how to help more people benefit, and priorities for the region.

What will it lead to? We want climate and nature policy to better take into account community knowledge and experience. We'll be sharing insights and priorities that you surface directly with Net Zero Hubs and the Department for Energy Security and Net Zero so they have more community-led evidence to help shape how they work and what they support. We also hope it will be an opportunity for you to create connections with others from across the region, and after the workshops we'll share back case study examples that we collect from across England.

Is there support to take part? All of our workshops are designed with accessibility in mind. We are able to support organisations who lack core funding to cover your travel or your time to take part.

Working towards the NHS net zero target by reducing “gas and air” waste

Manchester University Foundation Trust: Working towards the NHS net zero target by reducing “gas and air” waste

Researchers at Manchester University NHS Foundation Trust (MFT) are working with Lancaster University to help hospitals reduce “gas and air” waste. This follows a £1 million award to the university by the National Institute for Health and Care Research (NIHR), to lead this research.

The project will explore how the NHS can reduce its carbon footprint by addressing waste associated with gas and air in maternity services, without restricting access to pain relief and while recognising the importance of choice in childbirth.
